Unique Collection of Vehicles to Sell at Auction

15 Vehicles from a private collection will sell at no reserve

TULSA, Okla. (August 20, 2010) — Leake Auction Company recently consigned a unique group of vehicles from a private collection in Texas for the Houston auction. The collection includes: a Chevrolet pumper fire truck, a Ford TT Texaco delivery truck, a military Delta Force attack vehicle and a Diamond T Shell gasoline tank truck. These vehicles, as well as others from the collection, will sell at no reserve during the annual Leake Collector Car Show & Auction. The auction will take place in the Houston Reliant Center, Hall E, September 17-18. Doors will open at 9am daily, and admission is only \$15 for adults, \$10 for seniors and \$7 for children. 400 cars are anticipated to cross the two-ring auction block. “The car market is stable right now, and cars are selling,” stated Richard Sevenoaks, president of Leake Auction Company. “We recently saw many successful auctions in Pebble Beach. People are definitely buying, however they are buying cautiously. With the fluctuation in the stock market and low rates being paid on CDs and savings, more people are investing in cars. Collecting cars remains a solid investment.”

A few other highlights from the auction include:

A 1965 Ford Mustang 2+2 Fastback with nut and bolt rotisserie restoration, zero miles since restoration, equipped with a 289 CI V-8 engine, 3-speed automatic transmission, dual exhaust and bucket seats.

A 1969 Ford Shelby Mustang GT500 with a 428 CI V-8 Cobra Jet engine with 4-speed manual transmission, Ram Air, deluxe interior, 3 spoke steering wheel, nut and bolt restoration. This Mustang has its Elite Marti Report and is listed in the Shelby Registry.

An extremely rare 1934 Ford Model 40 Deluxe Phaeton that was the Winner of Class at Wheels and Keels in Seabrook. It is equipped with 221 CI V-8 engine with aluminum heads, 3-speed manual sliding gear transmission and a 112" wheel base.

A 1960 Chevrolet Corvette Roadster with all numbers matching, has been restored to NCRS standards and features a 283 CI V-8 engine, 4-speed transmission, two tops and Wonder Bar radio. This corvette is an NCRS Top Flight award winner.

A 1964 Chevrolet Corvette Coupe, which is a Triple Crown winner. It an NCRS Top Flight award winner and received a Bloomington Gold and Vette Fest Golden Spinner award. It is equipped with 327 CI / 300 HP V-8 engine, M-20 4-speed transmission, 3.08 positraction rear, power steering and brakes, air conditioning and AM/FM radio. It is one of 8,304 coupes produced.

“Houston is a prime market for a car auction. As the fourth largest city in the United States, there are many car collectors in the area. Fortunately Houston has weathered the economic tide better than most cities,” Sevenoaks continued. “We anticipate a successful auction.”
